
THE TEXT

Finding hope at home

- 1) For most of her life, 18-year-old Teala Carter didn't have a home to call her own. Nor did she have an adult to show her unconditional love. When Teala was 2, her mother died, leaving her with her maternal grandmother in Yorktown, Virginia. *"I'm proud of the fact that after all I've been through, I'm still able to put a smile on my face,"* Teala says today. After her grandmother became ill and entered a nursing home four years later, Child Protective Services moved Teala to New York City to live with her aunt. There, Teala often suffered from her aunt's physical wrath, until 1999, when she was finally sent to live with her older siblings in Lowell, Massachusetts.
- 2) This placement, too, was less than ideal, and after Teala told a guidance counselor the following year that her brother had hit her, the Department of Social Services took custody. Then, in June 2000, Teala was taken to the home of The Obikas, who agreed quickly to be Teala's permanent foster parents. *"All my life, I felt unloved and unwanted by everyone,"* Teala says. *"But now, there are two people in my life who really care about me."*
- 3) Now a senior at Lowell High School, Teala earns A's and B's and is a member of the math and science club. She also has two part-time jobs in order to save money for college, but still makes time to help out younger kids in need – she tutors first-graders weekly and mentors fellow foster children.
