The Eurotunnel is a 50.5 km tunnel which crosses the Channel under the sea, linking France

and the UK. There are trains which carry passengers and cars, and others which carry heavier (**vehicles – goods – motorists**) like coaches and lorries.

The Eurotunnel is a very (**available – convenient – frequent**) way of travelling between the two countries as the journey is quick, cheap, and comfortable. The tunnel operates every day, round the clock. At (**boarding - peak – departure**) time, there are up to three trains per hour to leave either Folkestone,



England or Calais, France as both terminals are crowded with passengers rushing from or back to their home country. Eurochunnel which is environmentally- friendly optimises its sources of energy through its



use of renewable energy, with the result that, by 2008, it had reduced its greenhouse gas (**depletion – destruction - emission**) by 45% and its electricity consumption by 7.5%.

There (**were – are - have been**) some problems with snow storms like the one in the winter of 2009/2010 which caused the interruption of services, leaving passengers stranded for more than 15 hours without light, heating, food or drink, inside a stationary train under the sea.

Each week here at *The North West Weekly* we choose one of our readers' best stories about something real but amazing that happened to him or her. This week's story is from Jennifer Dos Santos, now living in Santa Fe, who tells us about the mysterious Dan Cooper.

I'll never forget that journey. It was a cold November day in 1971 and I was flying from Portland to Seattle to visit my family. I was reading a magazine on the plane, so I didn't speak to the businessman next to me. But I remember him very clearly. He was wearing a smart suit and dark sunglasses and he wasn't acting strangely or doing anything unusual at all.

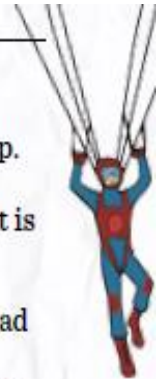


15 After an hour, he called the flight attendant. He talked quietly to her and opened his briefcase, but I didn't see what was inside. Next he got up and

20 followed her to the front of the plane and he didn't return to his seat for the rest of the trip. Anyway, we arrived safely in Seattle, and all the passengers got off the plane. At least, that is what we thought happened.

I only learnt the truth the next day when I read the headlines in the newspaper. In fact, the plane didn't stay in Seattle but it flew down to Mexico. Apparently the man in the suit – Dan Cooper – was a hijacker! He told the flight attendant that he had a bomb in his briefcase, and he demanded \$200,000 and four parachutes. When the plane landed in Seattle, the pilot received the money and the parachutes. Then the hijacker forced the plane to fly to Mexico. Suddenly, Dan Cooper put on his parachute and opened the door of the plane. Then he jumped – with all the money in his briefcase!

What happened next? Nobody knows... Dan Cooper just disappeared into thin air!



Did you know...?

- The hijacking of Northwest Orient Airlines flight 305 from Portland to Seattle is a true story. One year after it happened, airports in the US started to use X-ray machines.
