I- READING COMPREHENSION (5 marks)

1. A council plans to prohibit new takeaways opening within 400 metres of schools, youth centres and parks to help combat child obesity and promote healthy eating .
2. Waltham Forest council, east London, also wants to bring in new planning rules to limit the number of fast foods in shopping centres and restrict their opening hours.
3. The council is one of the first local authorities in Britain to propose such restrictions, which were suggested in the government's strategy to fight obesity.
4. Waltham Forest council said child obesity is higher there than the national average – with 17.2 % of children obese, compared with 15 % across England. Another 11.5 % of children in the area are overweight.
5. "We don't want to tell people how to live their lives - but at the moment residents simply don't have enough choice because of the amount of fast food takeaways," said Clyde Loakes, the council leader. "We're sure our residents will agree with what we are trying to do."
6. Waltham Forest council chose to act after residents complained about noise, litter and antisocial behaviour associated with the takeaways.
7. Another council is trying to reform takeaway food. Environmental health officers in Barking and Dagenham are planning to work with local restaurants and takeaways to try to change the food options they offer.
